

ELECTRONICS TECHNICIAN

Electronics Technicians are the designated electronics specialists responsible for material control, maintenance, repair and operation of all the electronic equipment onboard the rig. Working under the direct supervision of the Senior Electrician, the Electronics Technician assists with ensuring operational integrity, preventive maintenance, installation/removal of electronic equipment, repair and record keeping of the ESV electronic systems and equipment down to the component level.

This position ensures all electronic devices operate correctly where and when required, and that all electronic systems operate within safety and regulatory body compliance standards.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist Senior Electrician in meeting and/or exceeding requirements by certification authorities and appropriate regulatory authorities.
- Trouble-shoot and repair faulty electronic systems including dynamic positioning system, ballast control system, communication and data acquisition systems, computers and navigational equipment.
- Observe Flag State, Classification Society and local authority rules and regulations
- Ensure all documentation pertaining to electronic equipment, including installation and equipment drawings, is maintained and updated as required to reflect current status
- Thoroughly document any alterations, improvements and/or changes to electronic systems and communicate these changes to supervisor.
- Actively participate in problem-solving during unexpected loss to minimize downtime.
- Ensure conformance to Remedial Offshore's Hot Work Permit, Lock-Out/Tag-Out, HAZOP and Confined Space Entry system(s) with any onboard operation assigned.
- Actively participate in activities such as pre-job safety meetings, pre-tour safety meetings, and on-the-job/vocational training, interacting professionally with other ESV departments.
- Coordinate outside schools, associated drills and inspections.
- Perform any other duties as directed by supervisor.

Expected qualifications

- Three years of experience in offshore operations preferred
- Technical or vocational certificate preferred
- Valid STCW 95 certificate
- Fluency in English with good reading and writing skills; bilingual ability is desirable.
- Basic computer skills
